Chaplain's Corner:

THE LAST BATTLE

Revelation 20: 8 "And shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Ma-gon (nations of the world) to gather them together to battle; the number of whom is as the sand of the sea."
